



Poems, Song, & Rhymes

Rhyming is introduced through poems, songs, and books. While it may seem silly to adults, rhyming is fun for children and plays an important role in reading success. As a key phonemic awareness skill, rhyming helps children hear and manipulate sounds in words, strengthening their oral language. It also helps them recognize the rhythm of language, which supports fluency and comprehension. Below are some of the poems the child will enjoy learning.




Overview

The goal of the *3 Year Curriculum* is to introduce the child to stories in the Bible from Genesis to Revelation. Play-based activities and sheets are provided for the stories. As part of the bundle, the ABCJesusLovesMe Interactive Bible Stories include an age-appropriate script that lets the child actively participate. Optional flannelgraph suggestions provide extra visual and tactile learning opportunities. Comprehension questions at the end of each story provide a natural way to continue the conversation.





Handwriting and Active Phonics

In the *3 Year Curriculum*, the child learns to form letters and numbers correctly through activities, formation chants and rhymes, phonics songs, and tracing. This is an important step in the pre-writing process, helping the child transition smoothly into handwriting. Activities include tactile letters and numbers, play dough formations, and process art. Entitled “Active Phonics,” each letter includes an example word and an action to help the child connect the letter to its phonetic sound.

Name Activities

In the *3 Year Curriculum*, the child follows a step-by-step process to successfully write their first name using guides.

Motor Skills

Fine motor skills develop a child’s ability to manipulate small objects and prepare for writing. Gross motor skills involve large muscle movements, such as running, jumping, and hopping, and support balance and coordination. Each Lesson Plan includes activities designed to strengthen both fine and gross motor skills. For best results, use crayons and pencils rather than markers or pens. Sample activities are provided below.

Unsure How to Teach?


Teaching a child a new concept can feel daunting. Where do I begin? What do I say? When do I say it? How do I get the child to sit still? Find the answers to these questions by scanning the QR code provided on the next page.

Bible

The goal of the *3 Year Curriculum* is to introduce the child to the core stories in the Bible. Always read the Scripture yourself to ensure you are familiar with the facts of the story. The ABCJLM Interactive Bible Stories offer an age-appropriate script designed to actively involve the child in the storytelling. This supplemental product is available as a digital download, included in the Curriculum bundle, or may be purchased separately on the ABCJLM website. See QR code on pg 7.

Bible Songs and Memory Verses

Timeless Bible songs have been carefully chosen to help the child memorize and embrace God’s Word. Each week also introduces a simple memory verse set to song. If a song is new to you, free videos with actions are included via the weekly QR codes to make learning easy. The Bible Song and Memory Verse Digital Download Packet, included in the Bundle, is another tool to aid in learning.



Example Weekly Bible Schedule

Day 1: **Read** the story from *The Beginner’s Bible*, using the page numbers listed in the Supplies.

Day 2: Read the **Interactive Bible Story script**. Use optional visuals such as flannelgraph or simple props.

Day 3: **Review** the script by reading it again, pausing to let the child fill in key points, names, or actions.

Day 4: Guide the child in **retelling** the story by prompting with simple questions (Who? What happened next?). Act out parts of the story together using motions or props.

Day 5: **Comprehension questions** are included in the Interactive Bible Stories Digital Download.

Math

Under the Math objectives, the child will be introduced to nine colors, eight shapes, sorting, spatial words, and patterns. The child will also learn numbers 0-15 through the use of tactile numbers, rhymes, hands-on activities, and number activity sheets.

Color and Shape Songs

Each color and shape is paired with a rhyme and matching actions. Frequently repeat the songs while performing the actions with the poster or a related manipulative. Rhyming supports early literacy development and prepares the child for reading. Point out how rhyming words sound the same at the end (e.g., back/black). The Color and Shape Digital Download Packets, included in the Bundle, provide a fun poster to practice the songs throughout the week.

“I am Learning” Objective Poster

The Objective Poster (found in the *3 Year Activity Book*) helps you track the weekly objectives. Transfer these objectives to the activity sheet and display it in a visible place. After a couple of times, this transfer usually takes less than 10 minutes. To reuse the sheet, place it in a dry erase pocket or picture frame and use a dry or wet erase marker. Preschools can also send the updated sheet home each week to encourage learning beyond the classroom.

Broken Crayons/Rainbow Write

Throughout the Curriculum, the child will use a broken crayon for coloring and writing. Occupational therapists have found that broken crayons (under 1” in length) naturally encourage the correct grip—holding the utensil with the thumb and index finger, supported by the middle finger. Use caution with children who still put items in their mouths. Additionally, the child will be instructed to “rainbow write.” This means the child writes once with a light color and then writes again using a darker color to create a “rainbow.” This technique allows the child to practice multiple times on the same worksheet with various colors. For more tips, scan the QR code provided.

Starting the 3 Year Curriculum

Numbers, Letters, and Theme

Throughout the *3 Year Curriculum*, the child will learn the formation of numbers 0–15. Each week also introduces a specific letter and theme, focusing on letter formation and phonemic sound.

Teach: Formation Rhymes and Chants

A Number Rhyme is included for each number to assist the child in learning formation. The original source of the rhymes is unknown. Just a few basic movements create all 26 letters of the alphabet. Simple Formation Chants teach these repeated motions. Say these rhymes and chants each time the child forms a number or letter to promote muscle memory and correct writing habits.

Activity: Tactile Numbers & Letters

Each week the child will be asked to trace a number or letter with their index finger on a tactile surface while reciting the corresponding Number Rhyme or Letter Formation Chant. Saying the rhyme or chant aloud helps reinforce correct formation. Always guide the child to trace from top to bottom, left to right, and counterclockwise. Tactile numbers and letters—also known as sandpaper or textured letters—are important at this age because 3-year-olds are still developing fine motor skills. The focus is on strengthening finger muscles rather than teaching handwriting.

If you're unsure about the correct formation of letters and numbers, consider ordering the 3" Uppercase, Lowercase, and Number activity sheets. These digital downloads can be turned into tactile letters and numbers by adding sand, glitter or yarn. The ABCJLM website offers additional ideas to make or purchase tactile cards. Activity: Play Dough

A fun, tactile way to teach number and letter formation is to have the child create play dough numbers and letters on the Number and Letter activity sheets. Teach the child to roll the play dough into long "snakes," forming the dough over the number or letter outline on the activity sheet. If the play dough sticks to the activity sheet, place the activity sheet inside a plastic protector. Find my favorite play dough recipe using the QR code.

Activity: Process Art

To introduce the child to various art media, counting, and phonetic sounds, the child will also create Number and Letter Art Books throughout the Curriculum. Focus on the process of creating art rather than the final product.

Optional: Letter and Number Books

The *My First Steps to Math* and *My First Steps to Reading* series by Jane Moncure are the best books I have found for teaching numbers, letters, and phonetic sounds. Although these books are no longer in print, I highly encourage you to search for them at public libraries, on Amazon, eBay, or in used book stores—they are that good! Each book is titled *My ___ Book* and may be read during the corresponding week.

Active Phonics

Each letter includes an example word and an action to help the child connect the letter to its phonetic sound. While writing letters has value, at this age it's more important for the child to focus on learning the sound and practicing letter formation through tracing. The ABC Letter Digital Download, included in the Bundle, provide a fun visual.

Poems

Phonemic Awareness

Phonemic awareness—the ability to hear, identify, and manipulate individual sounds—is critical for reading and spelling success. In the *3 Year Curriculum*, this important skill is introduced each week through fingerplays, poems, and books.

Although these activities may seem silly to adults, they are both fun for the child and essential for early literacy development. Rhyming helps the child hear and play with sounds in words, improves oral language skills, and builds a strong foundation for reading fluency and comprehension. As the child becomes familiar with poems and books, they begin to anticipate rhyming words and recognize the rhythm of language.

Children develop phonemic awareness at their own pace. Introduce and discuss rhymes patiently, trusting that with time, the child's skills will grow naturally.

The Poem Digital Download Packet, included in the Bundle, is a helpful tool for posting and practicing poems.

Name

In the *3 Year Curriculum*, the child will be guided through a specific process to learn how to trace his or her first name. Follow the child's pace and ensure they have fully grasped the current step before moving on to the next one.

Starting the 3 Year Curriculum

Books

Experts agree that children should be read to for at least 15 minutes a day. Each week the child will be introduced to a quality picture book to supplement other learning and provide pre-reading exposure. Read the selected book at least once daily for maximum learning. “When young children hear the same story, song, or phrase repeatedly, their brains are actually building and strengthening neural pathways. These connections—formed through repeated, familiar experiences—lay the foundation for memory, language development, and deeper understanding.”

Example Weekly Reading Schedule

Day 1: Picture Walk

Before reading, guide the child through a “picture walk.” Look through the illustrations together and predict what the story might be about. Encourage the child to describe what they see and make guesses about the plot. This helps build excitement for the story, improves comprehension, stimulates creativity, and teaches children to use visual cues as a reading tool. Learn more in the QR code.

Day 2: Read with Expression

Read the book aloud with excitement and animated voices. Use facial expressions and tone to bring the story to life and keep the child engaged.

Day 3: Vocabulary

Each week I have selected words from the books that the child may not be familiar with. These words are purposefully chosen to expand the child’s vocabulary, especially for dual-language learners. For each word, provide extra context to help the child understand its meaning. Introduce more or less words based on the child’s exposure.

Day 4: Make Connections

While reading, connect the story to the child’s own experiences. Ask questions like, “Have you ever felt like the character?” or “When have you done something like this?”

Day 5: Summarize the Story

Help the child retell the story by identifying what happened at the beginning, middle, and end. Encourage the child to use their own words and point to illustrations for support if needed. Being able to determine the key points is a crucial learning step.

Development

Fine and Gross Motor Activities

Fine motor skills involve the ability to manipulate small objects and write, while gross motor skills focus on large muscle movements like running, jumping, and hopping. Both types of skills are important for pencil control, balance, and coordination. Each Lesson Plan includes activities to strengthen both skills.

Children develop fine motor skills best when they work on a vertical surface. While holding a writing utensil or brush against a vertical surface, muscles in the wrist and hand are strengthened. These same muscles are not used when writing on a horizontal surface. For this reason, place craft, writing, and drawing projects on a vertical surface as much as is feasible (i.e. on an easel, wall, or door). Instead of markers and pens, use broken crayons and short pencils to better support muscle development.

Intentional Play

Throughout the Lesson Plans, Intentional Play ideas are included to help you naturally weave learning into play. These suggestions often work well as learning centers activities.





Activity: Coffee Filter Earth

Place a coffee filter over the Earth image on the Creation activity sheet. Using green and blue washable markers, trace the Earth shape onto the filter. Hang the coffee filter on a vertical surface with a container underneath to catch any dripping water. Encourage the child to spray the filter with water, then watch as the colors blend. Once dry, glue the coffee filter onto the activity sheet.

Over the next 11 weeks, the child will be introduced to 9 colors through songs, hands-on activities, and by creating a colorful caterpillar.




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Activity: Tactile Number

Guide the child to use the index finger of their dominant hand to trace the tactile number while saying the Number Rhyme aloud.

Activity: Play Dough

Roll the black play dough into a long snake shape. Then curve it into the shape of the number 0 and place it on top of the Number 0 activity sheet.



Activity: Process Art

Color the Number 0 activity sheet with a black broken crayon. Add no stickers to the activity sheet. Keep the Number activity sheet to create a book at the end of the Curriculum.

Intentional Play

Since zero can be a difficult concept to understand, explain that zero means "none." Play a fun game by asking the child to jump up and down, clap, and say the child's name zero times.



Decorate the Letter Aa activity sheet with farm animal stickers. Emphasize the /a/ sound in the word "animals."

Teach: Name

Write the child's name on a notecard. Each week ask the child if the Letter of the Week appears in her name. You can also include on notecards the names of family members or classmates. Write each name on a notecard. Create a wall chart with the title "Is the letter _____ in your name?" and two columns labeled "Yes" and "No." Place each name in the appropriate column. Repeat this activity each week. Learn more in the QR code.


Introduce the child to his name in print. With large, print letters, write the child's name using uppercase for the first letter and lowercase letters for the rest. Tape name labels on the child's items (e.g. cubby or hook, table or circle seat).

Throughout the day point to the label and explain to the child that the letters spell his name. Periodically ask the child what the name label says.






Development

Fine Motor Activity:
Peg Puzzles

Play with peg puzzles, encouraging the child to pick up the pieces using their thumb and index finger. This strengthens the fingers for holding a pencil.



Gross Motor Activity: Barnyard Dance

This week, dance the Barnyard Dance while reading the book *Barnyard Dance* (e.g. bounce, strut, spin, trot, leap).

Assessment

The 3 Year Assessment is designed to measure what the child knows at the start of the *3 Year Curriculum* and to track progress throughout the year. The assessment should be completed three times—during Weeks 1, 19, and 36—and is most effective when done one-on-one. Assessment sheets can be found in the Activity Book. 
Overview

Story: Luke 2:1-7
